What is Housing First?

The Housing First (HF) approach originated in the United States during the 1990s is based on gaining immediate access to independent apartments with support from a team of health workers for chronically homeless people and groups assessed as at risk of homelessness



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Core Principles of Housing First*

- 1. Housing is a Human Right
- 2. Choice and Control for Service Users
- 3. Separation of Housing and Treatment
- 4. Recovery Orientation
- 5. Harm Reduction
- 6. Active Engagement without Coercion
- 7. Person Centred Planning
- 8. Flexible Support for as long as is requested

Housing First supports people who are homeless and living with mental liness by combining the immediate provision of bermanent housing with wrap-around supports.

How was Housing First in Italy born?

→ Bottom up process promoted by fio.PSD* (2014-2016)

Main stages:

- National Conference on Housing First
- National Program for Implementing Housing First (training, supervision and evaluation of projects)
- Born of the **Network of Housing First Italy** (54 organizations)
- Launch of **pilot projects** for implementing Housing First in Italy

* fio.PSD is the umbrella organization of public and private organizations providing services for homeless people







Numbers of Experimentation (2014-2016)

27 Medium and big sized Italian cities (Turin, Milan, Boulogne, Pisa, Padua, Ragusa, Siracusa, Cosenza, Pordenone, etc...)

- 54 Public and private organizations working with homeless people
- **120** Social workers
- 50 Volounteers
- **10** Researchers
- 5 International Experts on HF
- **5** Universities

How was analyzed Housing first in Italy?

→ By Scientific Committee*

- Team of 10 expert, researchers, professors and senior evaluators
- Multi-disciplinary approaches
- Mixed methods
- Involvement of providers, social workers and beneficiaries in the evaluation design
- Monitoring Plan
- Evaluation Plan

Beneficiaries

688 HF users in two years (2014-2016)

456 adults (and 232 children)

- Roofless: 37%
- ➢ Houseless: 32%
- People living in insecure housing: 25%
- People living in inadequate housing: 6%
- 70% Man and 30% Woman
- ➢ 51% Italians e 49% Migrants
- 51 years old (average age)
- Low school level
- Lack of Income, Job, Housing, Family relationship





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Relevant Target Group: Chronic Homeless People and Family Homelessness







Results \rightarrow Beneficiaries

456 adults

(356 housed* + 98 out of program)

- ✓ 61 adults get in autonomy**
- ✓ 31 people have **abandoned** program
- ✓ 6 get off for health or other problems

* "Housed" means: people maintaining the house after two years (31-12-2016)



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<u>Play</u>

** "Autonomy" means: people getting independent housing and job; family reunification; repatriation





Provided Housing

190 apartments

- ➢ 70% private rental market
- ➢ 14% social/public rental sector
- ➢ 16% religious property
- > 29% single apartments
- ➢ 40% apartments for family
- ➢ 31% co-housing









Results → Health, Social Integration, Satisfaction*

- > 22% of HF users** declare improvening in physical health and 10% worsening**
- > 56% declare stable level of mental health
- > 80% meet friends outside of home and enjoy of the neighbourhoods
- ➢ 68% make new friends
- ➢ 78% feel «at home»
- > 37% know neighbors
- ➢ High score (4/5) of the Quality of the Support and Housing Delivering

** People start to take care of themeselves and to recognize ills or minor disabilities







Housing First Costs*

- Average monthly cost for adult: 572,00 euros
- Average monthly cost for household: 626,00 euros
- Average daily cost for adult: 20,89 euros

- * «costs» include: Personal cost; Housing sustainment; Additional Services (lawyer, doctors, psychologist, counsellor or coach)

Design and Ethnographic Observation *

- Essential and functional furnitures into the apartments
- > A lots of «personal objects» (crucifixes, bible/Quran, cards, pictures, abat-jour) and other "things" reflecting attitudes of the users
- High relevance on habits, preferences, feeling, interests of the users in the self-manage interior design

Current policy statement of Housing First in Italy

- New deal of the Network Housing First Italy "From the Project to the System" (2017-2019)
- Housing First is recognized as strategic way for tackling Homelessness in to the National Anti-Poverty Plan and in Guideline by Ministry of Labor and Social Policy
- Large scale funding (50 milion of euros ESF and FEAD) from the Nationale Government to Municipalities and Regional governments to renovate territorial services also by Housing First Approach
